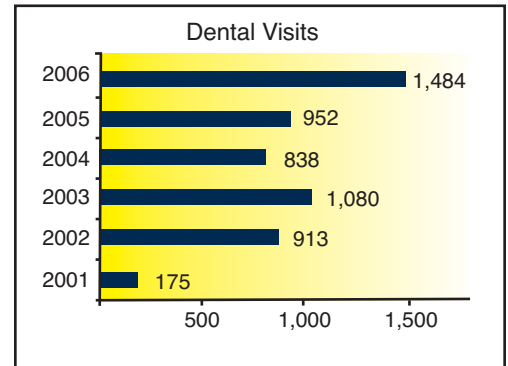
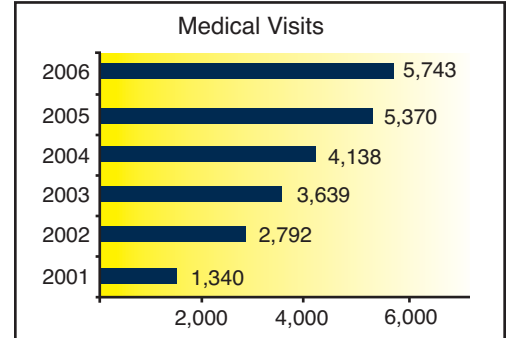


HealthLink Medical Center (HLMC) has witnessed an incredible increase in patients since its doors first opened. In 2001 we had 1,560 medical patient visits. In 2006 medical patient visits increased by 368% to 5,743. Dental visits have increased 848% from 175 to 1,485. In the last year, our dedicated staff and volunteers cared for almost 2,000 patients during more than 7,000 office visits.

While it's unfortunate that there's such an increase in the number of people who are without health insurance, it's gratifying to see the groundswell of support from volunteers. Our valuable volunteers are committed to providing free medical and dental care for their neighbors in need.

The volunteer HealthLink community includes physicians, nurses, dentists, hygienists, and all types of healthcare professionals. The clinic is also supported by the generous commitment of time and skill from electricians, masons, HVAC professionals, graphic designers, marketing professionals, and administrative supporters, just to name a few.

Dear Friends,



For everything there is a time. This has always been one of my favorite verses. I would like to reflect on the second verse of "A Time for Everything"—a time to plant and a time to uproot.

In 1998 Eugene Jackson had the opportunity to visit a free health clinic. As a result of this visit, HealthLink's seed was planted and this seed fell on fertile ground.

That seed was tended and cared for and became strong. There was a period of gestation, but not stagnation, as work went on behind the scenes. The most productive time in the cycle of many plants is the dormant season. When it appears that nothing is going on, the plant is being prepared for new, healthy, hearty growth. In 2001 the plant was in full bloom, resulting in the birth of HealthLink Medical Center.

Now it is time for me to uproot. For me this means that I will be retiring from HealthLink at the end of July. As I reflect on my time with HealthLink, this is a time of sadness and also a time of happiness. I'm sad that I will be leaving HealthLink in a few short months, but happy that I have come to know so many of you and have built relationships with donors, staff, patients, and volunteers, which will endure for years to come.

For the past eight years my life has been enriched as I have had the privilege of watching that seed grow here at HealthLink. Thousands of employed, uninsured adults living in Bucks or Montgomery County are able to receive free medical and dental care and medications. Day after day, I have been inspired to witness physicians, dentists, nurse practitioners, nurses, dental hygienists, pharmacists, other healthcare professionals, and administrative volunteers give generously of their time and expertise on behalf of our patients. Today, the seed planted by Mr. Jackson continues to flourish, and I am most grateful to all of you who continue to play a part in the growth and development of HealthLink.

It has been rewarding to have met so many extremely generous people who give so generously of themselves. This caring extends even beyond the individual volunteers. One of the first steps in creating HealthLink was finding a physical location for it. Once found, the building, which originally had been a ranch-style house, needed to be renovated. Our friends at Turner Construction Company (and its sub-contractors) very generously donated both

labor and materials and created a first-class medical center--HealthLink. Later, we had to arrange for all the services we now provide. I boldly visited Chief Executive Officers at area hospitals and asked if they would support HealthLink by donating lab services. Nearly all of them said yes! Several years ago, I planned HealthLink's first golf fundraiser. Spring Mill Country Club generously donates the use of the carts and the course for this yearly event. Over the years, many wonderful people have been involved in planning the event, playing in it, and donating prizes. The most rewarding aspect of my time at HealthLink, however, has been meeting, talking to and receiving letters from our patients. This includes those who created HealthLink as well as those who give so freely of themselves by volunteering or supporting the organization financially. It couldn't happen without all of you!

We are fortunate to have recently hired a Director of Development, Barbara Latady, who will be taking over my fund-raising duties. I'm sure she can count on your continued interest and support.

HealthLink will continue to be a great place. It has been a joy to be here. I will miss all of you, but you will always be remembered in my prayers.
